
I was extremely pleased to hear that Haselworth Primary School has achieved a 'GOOD' overall Ofsted rating, a credit to the hard work of staff and pupils.

In Parliament, good news this month as Finn's Law finally reached Royal Assent, protecting our service animals. We have seen changes to income tax National Living Wage which will see more money in the pockets of hard working local people. The Online Harms White Paper has also been published, outlining plans for world-leading online safety. As part of Autism Awareness Week I was very proud to become the <u>first MP to</u> complete an Understanding Autism course on a visit to the National Autistic Society. As the Every Day Is Different adult social care recruitment campaign came to an end, I met with care workers in Parliament to thank them for their involvement.

I know that healthcare is a hot topic in my surgeries, which is why I am hosting a Gosport Health Forum on May 17th with representatives in everything from GPs to ambulances and QA Hospital to dentistry. I had a chance to catch up with our police Chief Inspector, Mark Lewis, to discuss local crime issues and the action being taken. We spoke about the need for more action on some of the low level crime that can be extremely distressful for local residents

and business owners.

I was updated on the disposal of the Royal Clarence Yard by Minister of Defence Tobias Ellwood. After years of putting pressure on the MOD, I am pleased to see the recent progress and care taken to ensure that its disposal will benefit our local area.

Coming up next month, apart from the Health Forum, the Gosport Marine Festival is returning on the 11th May, with more than 600 opportunities to get afloat for all the family!
