








Hampshire & Isle of Wight MPs in Westminster



Boosting educational attainment is vital to give children the skills they need to succeed later in life and my visits to local schools are always some of my favourite engagements. This month I met fabulous Year 6 pupils at St John's Primary and discussed higher education funding at St Vincent College. I also attended the official opening of the Gateway Preschool at Leesland. Many parents were concerned when the school faced closure last year so it is wonderful that Hampshire County Council has invested in a new site at Leesland Junior School in order to maintain this valuable local facility.

At Harrison Primary school in Fareham, I learned about the School Centre for Initial Teacher Training (SCITT). Through this scheme, trainee teachers work for a year towards a Primary PGCE qualification in a local school setting. They are recruiting for next year so if you have a degree qualification and are considering teaching then please click here.

Health issues were also at the top of my agenda. I was inspired by the 'Slimmers' at Alverstoke Slimming World who in just 24 weeks lost a scale shattering 232 stone and a half a pound combined! Getting fit and making informed food choices is helping them become healthier, happier and more confident.

At QA hospital I met with healthcare bosses alongside other local MPs. We discussed a number of local and national health issues including vascular services and Junior Doctor's contracts.

This month I backed a British Heart Foundation and Department of Health scheme to increase the number of defibrillators in England. People in our area need access to lifesaving care in times of emergency, so I wrote to local organisations urging them to apply for the fully-funded defibrillators. I have been delighted by their enthusiastic response.



I visited both Gosport and Fareham Women's Refuges, run by the Southern Domestic Abuse Service (SDAS). Women and children fleeing abuse are provided with vital short term accommodation and both women and men suffering from emotional, physical or sexual abuse are able to access confidential support services. I also met with a representative from the Hampshire and Isle of Wight Community Rehabilitation Company which has the contract to support local people in the criminal justice system as part of the Transforming Rehabilitation reforms. Among their programmes is the About Turn Project which provides open access drop-in sessions for over-18s in our area with drug and alcohol problems.

The Gosport constituency's strong ethos of community care and support is globalised by the international outreach of charities like Farm4Life and the



people's lives across the world.

Our local military organisations also do fantastic charitable work. I was honoured to help Captain Trevor Gulley from HMS Sultan hand over cheques totalling £26,000 to local charities. This huge sum was raised from proceeds of their fabulous Summer Show. Later in the month I met Sultan personnel in London selling poppies to raise money for the Royal British Legion - a real testament to their generosity and compassion. At Castaway House over in Portsmouth, I met with groups including the Royal Naval Benevolent Trust, Seafarers UK and the Naval Families Federation, which offer welfare and financial support to service men and women, veterans and their families. Some of these groups have benefited from the Chancellor's decision to channel the LIBOR fines to military charities.

In other good news, I was really pleased to congratulate local volunteer Anna Dent for her excellent work in our local branch of the National Childbirth Trust when she was nominated for an award in Parliament. I also welcomed my friends from Choices Advocacy to Parliament ahead of their tour of Westminster. Choices Advocacy is a wonderful Hampshire-based charity working

with people who have learning difficulties.

Finally, Miss Flea, a Jack Russell from the RSPCA Stubbington Ark and I entered the Westminster Dog of the Year Competition. We completed an agility course and were interviewed by a tough judging panel. Sadly we did not win but Miss Flea put on a brilliant show and was certainly a winner in my eyes!

Looking forward to next month I will be hosting a Disability Confident event for local businesses, encouraging them to employ staff with physical disabilities or learning difficulties.
