Conservative Manifesto


It is fantastic to see a strong and realistic Conservative manifesto which tackles people's priorities:

I had the honour of laying a wreath at the Gosport Remembrance Service and joining residents. veterans and service personnel and their families, in taking a moment to reflect on the sacrifices made by our forces. I was joined by my husband who has been first a soldier and then



a reservist in the British Army for 30 years.

As usual, we have had an action-packed month across the constituency, from Christmas festivities to visiting fantastic local organisations. This month though also had the added excitement of election campaigning!

The campaign kickstarted on the high streets of Gosport, Stubbington and Leeon-the-Solent, talking to residents about their concerns, Brexit frustrations and what they want to see going into the New Year.

Despite the leafleting, door knocking and stall chatter, as ever I have had the opportunity to keep up to date across Gosport, Hill Head, Stubbington and Lee-on-the-Solent. I joined Motiv8 - a local youth charity - in their celebration of youth work at the launch of Tim Claey's book Keeping Them Off The Streets.'

We celebrated Stubbington village centre becoming <u>Dementia Friendly</u> with an event at Holy Rood Church with local groups and traders. I joined the <u>Stubbington Memory Cafe</u> - which provides a space for people living with dementia, and their family carers to socialise, this time with with entertainment provided by the excellent Stokes Bay Strummers.

The Citizens Advice Bureau has secured funding for a new service - providing welfare and benefits advocates - I joined the launch of the scheme which will help local residents with appeals within the benefits system.



Congratulations also to Acts of Kindness - a charity supporting those in crisis from crime to domestic abuse - who have opened a brand new Gosport and Fareham community hub on Gosport Road. It was my pleasure to get stuck in and leave my mark on the new centre.

I also joined <u>Marvels and Meltdowns</u>, who support autistic children and families, for their AGM and attended the annual gala of the fantastic <u>Suki Aerobic Gymnastics</u>, with some displays of flexibility which got my head spinning more than some Parliamentary debates!

Since I first started the <u>Gosport Enterprise Fair</u> in 2016 - helping local businesses connect and grow - it has been fantastic to see how it has grown over the years. I dropped in to see this year's participants and enterprises, talking about investment within our local area.

It was good to also meet the new head of Meocross School - Mark Cripps - discussing the issues the school faces and his plans for the future. I also caught up with the lovely staff and residents of the Tudor Lodge care home.

It was great to catch up with the brave and talented kids and their fantastic adult volunteers at <u>Tigers Motorcycle Display Team</u> who raise funds for different local charities at their displays, this month they handed over cheques including £1500 for the Children's Bubbles Fund and £1715 for Portsmouth Downs Syndrome Association.



The seasonal merriment has officially kicked off - I joined residents at an array of different Christmas markets with a range of festive treats and gifts from local producers. I also had fun taking part in a spot of cheerleading aerobics (who knew that was a thing?!) at the Gosportarians Christmas Tea & Social Dance and Blind Club Christmas Party!

As the nights draw in it was great to attend the festive celebrations at both the Gosport and Lee-on-the-Solent Christmas lights switch ons. Don't forget the Alverstoke Christmas Tree Festival is on December 5th and the Stubbington light switch on is December 7th!
